
## Iraq Situation Report: December 16-17, 2014



The Iraqi Kurdish Peshmerga launched operations in western Ninewa province that indicate the possibility of operations to clear the Islamic State of Iraq and al-Sham (ISIS) from Sinjar district. Any impending operations in Sinjar will indicate the desire of the Iraqi Kurdish leadership to prioritize the clearing of Sinjar which is the most significant area that fell to ISIS in August when it made a push towards Peshmerga-controlled areas in Ninewa province. It is also important to note the reports of Counter-Terrorism Service (CTS) forces collaborating with the Peshmerga to target ISIS. Both forces collaborated in August to clear the Mosul Dam and, if true, this could be an indication of further collaboration in any operations to clear Mosul. ISIS continues to challenge the Iraqi Security Forces (ISF) and anti-ISIS tribes in the Baiji area in northern Iraq which was cleared in mid-November. Reports continue to conflict about the exact situation, but these developments mean that it will be difficult for the ISF to make a push north of Baiji to areas south of Mosul.
